
## Overview program of ICs for IMSs

#### Aim:

- regular intervals
- selfsustained
- to enable IMSs to show compliance with approval and accreditation requirements

#### **Rithm:**

- Whole body photon: every 2 years
- Extremity (& eye lens?): every 4 years
- Neutrons: every 5 years






## How did the organizers learn?

- Regular meetings OG coordinator
- During ICs: feedback on draft results from participants
- After ICs: participant meetings and questionnaires
- Looking at development of number of participants
- OG self-evaluation





## Number of participants, photon whole body ICs





### **Some observations:**

- EURADOS IC Certificates of Participation very well accepted by authorities / accreditation bodies
- Positive feedback from participating IMSs
- High level confidentiality and quality
- Due to the high (and growing) number of participants, coordination and performing the irradiations are big (and growing) challenges
- Continuous concerns for background and transit doses
- Publication of EURADOS reports takes too long



## Some preliminary conclusions/recommendations:

- Many good reasons to continue the cycle of intercomparisons for Individual Monitoring Services
- Appoint coordinating institute for one or more ICs
  - preferably not being an IMS to avoid possible conflict of interest
  - to combine with irradiations to simplify organization and to reduce risk of transit dose?
- OG acts as steering committee
  - 4 to 5 persons
  - mix of people from IMSs and having knowledge of irradiation/calibration procedures and facilities
- Simpler format EURADOS reports (shorter)
